A.L. Batting and Bench Lineup Card

Below is a sample lineup card for this upcoming season. As you can see, on this side of the card you show your starting lineup, along with your bench players, listed in the order you'd like them to be used. Putting a Y in the steal column means a player will attempt to steal under certain situations (limited by how often he stole in the majors). Earliest sac bunt is the earliest inning you'd like a player to attempt a sacrifice bunt (if the situation warrants one.) A dash in the 'Rank or Pinch Hit for' column means you want that player to be pinch hit for if you are behind late in the game. The highest ranked pinch hitter available will come in to hit (you also rank your starters in case they don't have enough at-bats left to start a game, but are on the bench and available for pinch hitting duty.) If you run entirely out of eligible players at some position, we'll provide an automatic replacement, similar to calling up a .200 hitter from the minors.

SAMPLE

A.L. Pitching and Defense Lineup Card

On this side of the card you show your pitching rotation, along with your bullpen pitchers, listed in the order you'd like them to be used as starters if needed. A pitcher gets replaced when he reaches his hook number. The **hook number** is equal to the **number of runs** that pitcher has allowed, **plus half** of the **runners** currently **on base**. Pitchers (as are batters) are limited to playing roughly as much as they did per week during that year in the majors, making a deep bullpen very important. If you run entirely out of pitchers, we'll provide an automatic replacement, similar to calling up a weak pitcher from the minors (ERA of about 6.00). Your closer will play as big a role for you as he does for a major league team.
